It is a pleasure to officially welcome your company as a participant in the Universal Product Code (U.P.C.) program.

The U.P.C. number system character and manufacturer identification number assigned to your company are shown above. Because this letter documents your company's membership in the UCC, it should be preserved and made a matter of permanent record. **The U.P.C. number system character and manufacturer identification number is for the sole use of the applicant and is a restricted asset of the member to whom it is assigned. Any other use of the number is prohibited including, but not limited to, renting, leasing, or subdividing all or a portion of the U.P.C. number.**

In the recording and video industries, the sixth digit of the company number (shown above) becomes the first position of the specific selection number. The manufacturer then assigns the remaining four digits of the selection number which is followed by a single digit configuration code which identifies the product as an LP, Cassette, VHS Video, Laserdisk, etc. These codes have been assigned and approved by the Recording Industry Association of America and the Video Software Dealers Association.

The check digit is calculated (see U.P.C. Implementation Guide, Appendix B) and becomes the 12th digit in the symbol. All 12 digits must also be printed in human readable form.

Please refer to the illustration on the following page to understand the structure of the entire 12 digit code.
